<u>The Economics Institute</u> is the JEP's flagship program and has been running continuously since 1976. In addition to the Economics Institute, the LEC offers symposia on issues that are timely and relevant to the judiciary and, for those judges who have attended the Economics Institute, the LEC offers advanced courses on a variety of topics. Treatment of Pregnant and Parenting Women: The Use of Medication Assisted Treatment

Every day in the United States, 24 babies are diagnosed and treated for withdrawal from prenatal-exposure opioids and 18 women die as a result of a prescription painkiller overdose. As the rates of opioid misuse increase in the general population, the rates of misuse also increase in the pregnant population bringing with it the intersection of drug addiction treatment and the judicial system. This webinar will summarize contextual and co-morbid factors observed among many women with substance use disorders, with a focus on opioid use disorders. It will compare and contrast the benefits and risks of providing methadone, buprenorphine, naltrexone or medication assisted-withdrawal during pregnancy for the mother, fetus and neonate. The end of the first year of thriveidaho is approaching, but you can still participate! The last day to submit documentation of your participation in the program is Wednesday, April 30, 2014.

Need a Support Program to Complete?

Digital Health Coaching is the perfect program to complete in these last four weeks of the program. To get started:

- Log into your BCI member portal,
- Select 'thriveidaho' from the left hand menu.

Once here, select the **'Personal Health Assessment'** link. The Digital Health Coaching modules appear here once you completed the PHA. There are five modules to choose from: physical activity, nutrition, stress management, weight management & smoking cessation. You only need to complete <u>one</u> of these modules to satisfy this requirement.
