Administrative Order 2021-19

George A. Southworth, Administrative District Judge of the Third Judicial District hereby finds and Orders as follows:

WHEREAS, on June 25, 2021 the Idaho Supreme Court issued its Amended Order entitled “EMERGENCY ORDER REGARDING COURT SERVICES.” Said Order contained the following requirements and prohibitions:

2. Administrative District Judges Authorized to Issue Orders Regarding Courthouse and Courtroom Risk Reduction Protocols in Their Districts: If, as reflected in [the Weekly Publication of COVID-19 Incidence Rates], a county’s seven-day moving average incidence rate of confirmed or presumed cases of COVID-19 is 25.0 or greater per 100,000 population, the Administrative District Judge shall enter an administrative order defining the safety protocols that will be required in the county’s courthouse. The Order will, at a minimum, require all persons entering the courthouse to do court business to wear a mask that covers the nose and mouth and maintain six feet of social distance from anyone that does not live in their household.

7. Weekly COVID-19 Incidence Rate Jury Trial Postponements: Jury proceedings, including jury trials and grand jury proceedings, may commence anytime during a calendar week unless the Administrative District Judge has determined that the County in which the prospective juror has been summoned to attend court has a seven-day moving average incidence rate of confirmed or presumed cases of COVID-19 of 25.0 or greater per 100,000 population as reflected on the Cases by County page of the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare’s COVID-19 Data Dashboard available at <https://coronavirus.idaho.gov>.

This order utilizes the data issued at the end of business on Thursday, August 26, 2021, when the daily state and county COVID-19 case numbers were released on-line by the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, for each of the counties in this district, as noted hereinafter.

1. Adams County

Adams County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 16.6 per 100,000 population. Adams County may resume jury trials for the calendar week of September 6, 2021.

2. Canyon County

Canyon County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 43.0 per 100,000 population. Canyon County jury trials remain suspended.

3. Gem County

Gem County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 22.1 per 100,000 population. Gem County may resume jury trials for the calendar week of September 6, 2021.

4. Owyhee County

Owyhee County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 24.2 per 100,000 population. Owyhee County may resume jury trials for the calendar week of September 6, 2021.

5. Payette County


Payette County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 48.3 per 100,000 population. Payette County jury trials remain suspended.

6. Washington County

Washington County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 43.4 per 100,000 population. Washington County jury trials remain suspended.
