Davis F. VanderVelde, Administrative District Judge of the Third Judicial District hereby finds and Orders as follows:

WHEREAS, on November 23, 2021 the Idaho Supreme Court issued its Order entitled "EMERGENCY ORDER REGARDING COURT SERVICES." Said Order contained the following requirements and prohibitions:

Regarding Courthouse and Courtroom Risk Reduction Protocols in Their Districts: If, as reflected in [the Weekly Publication of COVID-19 Incidence Rates], a county's seven-day moving average incidence rate of confirmed or presumed cases of COVID-19 is 25.0 or greater per 100,000 population, the Administrative District Judge shall enter an administrative order defining the safety protocols that will be required in the county's courthouse. The Order will, at a minimum, require all persons entering the courthouse to do court business to wear a mask that covers the nose and mouth and maintain six feet of social distance from anyone that does not live in their household.

7. Weekly COVID-19 Incidence Rate Jury Trial Postponements: Jury proceedings, including jury trials and grand jury proceedings, may commence

anytime during a calendar week unless the Administrative District Judge has determined that the County in which the prospective juror has been summoned to attend court has a seven-day moving average incidence rate of confirmed or presumed cases of COVID-19 of 25.0 or greater per 100,000 population as reflected on the Cases by County page of the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare's COVID-19 Data Dashboard available at https://coronavirus.idaho.gov.

This order utilizes the data issued at the end of business on Wednesday, November 24, 2021, when the daily state and county COVID-19 case numbers were released on-line by the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, for each of the counties in this district, as noted hereinafter.

1. Adams County

Adams County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 0.0 per 100,000 population. Adams County may resume jury trials beginning December 7, 2021.

2. Canyon County

Canyon County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 13.9 per 100,000 population. Canyon County may resume jury trials beginning December 7, 2021.

Gem County

Gem County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 9.5 per 100,000 population. Gem County may resume jury trials beginning December 7, 2021.

Owyhee County

Owyhee County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 18.1 per 100,000 population. Owyhee County may resume jury trials beginning December 7, 2021.

Payette County

Payette County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 6.6 per 100,000 population. Payette County may resume jury trials beginning December 7, 2021.

Washington County

Washington County has a seven-day moving COVID-19 case average of 4.2 per 100,000 population. Washington County may resume jury trials beginning December 7, 2021.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all persons entering a court facility in the Third Judicial District of Idaho, to include the counties of Adams, Canyon, Gem, Payette, Owyhee and Washington, to do court business, shall be subject to and maintain the following protocols:

1. All persons are required to wear a mask while in a court facility on court business.

2. All person, not of the same household, must observe a minimum of six fee of social distancing from other persons.

This Order is to remain in effect until further Order from the Court.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED.
