WHEREAS the Idaho Supreme Court is committed to its mission of ensuring access to justice within the courts of this State; and,

WHEREAS the Court Assistance Office programs throughout the State continue to provide a critical route for self-represented people to secure that access to justice; and,

WHEREAS the Court Assistance Office Committee is charged as follows:

- Research and study the barriers faced and the needs of those persons of low income or modest means and those choosing to proceed unrepresented by attorneys when accessing the court system;
- Recommend the development of resources and services in those areas of highest need for persons of low income or modest means and those who choose to proceed unrepresented;
- Recommend policies, guidelines, and best practices that further equal and meaningful access to the court for all services provided by the Court Assistance Office for self-represented litigants;
- Evaluate options and make recommendations for the use of technology that increases the accessibility
  of information and resources to self-represented litigants; improves the efficiency of delivery of
  services, and maximizes available resources;
- Develop and promulgate simplified court forms for use by self-represented litigants, and incorporate the principles of plain language into forms, interactive form interviews, instructions, and written communication provided by the Court Assistance Office;
- Partner with key stakeholders including the bench, the bar, government, nonprofit organizations and others in the development of resources and services;
- Coordinate with other Supreme Court Committees that have an impact on issues that affect selfrepresented litigants;
- Examine and consider long term funding strategies to permit development and implementation of Court Assistance Office services.

The Court Assistance Office Committee shall meet regularly and shall report periodically to the Administrative Conference and to the Court on actions taken, as well as recommendations for improvements to judicial and non-judicial education.

The Court, having received a recommendation from Judge Michael Dean, Chair of the Court Assistance Office Committee, and in coordination and consultation with Amy Stack, Principal Manager, Court Access and Operations;
