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GAL/CASA Volunteer Impact To Children/Youth in Idaho

GAL/CASA programs are of, and for the

community. Across Idaho, there are seven GAL/CASA programs doing the hands-on work of recruiting, training and supervising GAL/CASA volunteers to advocate for children and families involved in the child welfare system and improve their well-being in all 44 counties in Idaho. These programs provide ongoing support and coaching for volunteers and develop innovative ways to make a difference for children, families and the community.

GAL/CASA volunteers support children and families involved in the child welfare system.

GAL/CASA volunteers stay by the child's side throughout the duration of the case, supporting them and their family. GAL/CASA volunteers advocate first for reunification when safe and possible, and work to keep children connected to their family and community of origin. They focus on facilitating nurturing relationships for the child and helping to find, engage and strengthen a support network for the child and family. The goal is to help achieve permanency, preferably reunification or adoption by relatives when safe and possible. If reunification is not safe or possible, GAL/CASA volunteers will advocate for the child to be adopted by, or live with, other relatives or family friends. If that is also not possible, GAL/CASA volunteers will work towards adoption by a non-relative.

During the last fiscal year, the seven GAL/ CASA Programs of Idaho served **2594** unique children/youth; trained **135** new GAL/CASA volunteers, and appointed **603** amazing volunteers to represent the best interest of Idaho's children who have suffered abuse, neglect, or abandonment.

As you will see in the following pages, the numbers are just the beginning. Idaho GAL/ CASA volunteers enhanced the lives of the children they served by improving outcomes around safety, permanency, and well-being.

The GAL/CASA programs and their staff routinely go above and beyond what is written in statute and Idaho Code to ensure the needs of the children/youth appointed to our programs are being met. Each GAL/CASA Program in Idaho collects donations from local community members. These donated items are routinely distributed to the children/youth and family being served. Donation items include but are not limited to hygiene products, diapers, baby wipes, backpacks, school supplies, books, toys, blankets, and stuffed animals. Furthermore, the GAL/CASA programs encourage volunteers and staff to be active community members surrounding child welfare topics sitting on many local boards, tasks forces, and committees.



Our Mission:

It is the mission of all seven Idaho CASA/GAL Programs to support and promote court-appointed volunteer advocacy so every child in Idaho who has experienced abuse or neglect can have a safe, permanent home and the opportunity to thrive. We know children do best when they can safely remain with their parents or with other family members. That's why Idaho's CASA/GAL volunteers commit to strengthening families in their ability to care for and protect their children while advocating for the child's best interest.

Idaho's Annual Statewide **CASA** Conference

On April 27th, 283 CASA Volunteers, pro bono attorneys, and program staff from all seven Judicial Districts gathered in-person and online to attend the 2nd Annual CASA Conference.

The day started with a welcome from Judge Andrew Ellis. Participants then listened to the lived-experience of keynote speaker, Cassidy Littleton, a former foster youth in Idaho. She shared her story of how she was motivated to change the rhetoric of her family's history and forge a brighter future for not only herself, but current foster children too.

Session one, Children's Mental Health, presented by Jill Hicks, a Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor and the Clinical Director for Bonner Behavioral Health. What happens in the first months and years of life can have lifelong impacts. Participants learned about children's developmental ages vs. chronological stages, children's brain development, the importance of play, and how to utilize this knowledge as child advocates.

Sqt. Todd Orr with the Idaho State Police presented session two: Idaho Drug Trends, a "trip" through Idaho. Sgt. Orr became a Standardized Field Sobriety Test Instructor and an internationally certified Drug Recognition Expert Instructor holding an Idaho POST general topics instructor certificate. Parental substance use is a prevalent factor associated with removing children from the parent's custody. He spoke to participants about how to identify and recognize various drugs and paraphernalia, such as Fentanyl and Marijuana, and the dangers these substances pose to our communities and Idaho's youth.



FY2024 Idaho Statewide Guardian ad Litem Legislative Report

The last session of the day was presented by Licensed Clinical Social Workers Courtney Morgan and Kimi Eames. Vicarious Trauma-When the work we love takes a toll. CASA Volunteers have all decided to work with trauma-impacted children and youth because we care deeply about making a difference, but what many didn't anticipate when they volunteered for CASA was that repeated exposure to traumatic material over time could take a toll on their mental health, motivation to do this work, and even on their ability to feel compassion for others and ourselves. The cumulative impact of trauma exposure over time is often referred to as Vicarious Trauma and almost all people who serve in helping professions or volunteer roles with significant trauma exposure are impacted at one point or another. The presenters shared information to support participants in identifying signs of vicarious trauma and discussed ways to use our body's innate wisdom to move through experiences of trauma exposure to help them prevent long term impact on the nervous system and stay connected to their passion for this work.

The conference produced a greater sense of community among volunteers enabling them to build connections with each other, to gain knowledge on topics that relate to child welfare, and to feel supported in the important role they fill in advocating for a child's best interest. The conference was made possible through a generous grant provided by the Idaho Governor's Task Force on Children at Risk.

Research that Supports the Effectiveness of GAL/CASA Best Interest Advocacy

As members of the NCASA network, each of the GAL/CASA Programs in Idaho is committed to using fact-based knowledge to evaluate the effectiveness of their best interest advocacy. Many independent academic studies have been conducted, and below is a summary of the results:

- A child with a GAL/CASA volunteer has significantly fewer placements than a child without a GAL/CASA volunteer.
- GAL/CASA involvement was associated with approximately one-third fewer foster care placements as well as significant reductions in time children spent in out-of-home placements.
- Judges report the impact of GAL/CASA volunteers is most pronounced in "promoting long-term well-being" (92.2%), followed by "appropriate services to child and family" (83%) and "psychological wellbeing" (79.9%).

- Outcomes for child victims of abuse and neglect are greatly improved when their representation includes the appointment of a GAL/CASA volunteer. These outcomes include children at the court who are ordered more services, and cases that are more likely to be permanently closed.
- Children report significantly higher levels of hope because they have a GAL/CASA volunteer who cares about them, who they can talk to, and who listens and understands.

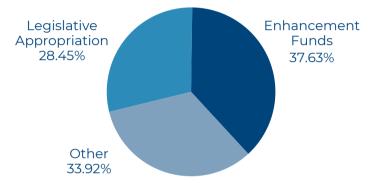
NCASA member programs adhere to a core model, operate under a national set of standards, receive quality assurance reviews, and seek to be highly effective local programs within the seven judicial districts of Idaho. As part of this, we follow a robust national training curriculum that complies with reporting requirements, extensive and ongoing Criminal History Check (accordance with ICAR 47), and are overseen by local and national governance.



Funding for Guardian ad Litem/Court Appointed Special Advocates Programs in Idaho

Since 2005, the Idaho Supreme Court has acted as the grant administrator for the Guardian ad litem account, pursuant to §I.C. 16-1638. Funds from the account were allocated to GAL Programs using two separate formulas for two distinct appropriations approved by the Idaho Legislature. The original General Fund appropriation approved by the Legislature was in the amount of \$625,000. Through efforts of the seven GAL programs in FY2018, the Legislature approved a second General Fund appropriation in the amount of \$467,500 to be explicitly used to recruit, train and retain GAL volunteers. Combined, these grants total \$1,092,500, minus grant administrator costs. How programs are funded:

- Grants;
- Private Contributions and Donations;
- County Allocations;
- Fundraising Activities;
- Legislative Appropriation;
- Enhancement Funds.







The seven guardian ad litem programs in our state play a crucial role in providing unwavering advocacy for every abused child, ensuring that their best interests are prioritized during challenging times. By offering compassionate support and guidance, these dedicated volunteers help foster children navigate the often tumultuous journey of foster care, significantly alleviating the trauma associated with their experiences. Each guardian ad litem serves as a steadfast advocate. empowering children and making their time in foster care not only more bearable but also enriching. Their commitment to enhancing the lives of these vulnerable children makes a profound difference, fostering resilience and hope in the face of adversity.

Duties of GAL/CASA Volunteers

Per Idaho Code §16-1633

Subject to the direction of the Court, the Guardian ad Litem shall advocate for the best interests of the child and shall have the following duties, which shall continue until resignation of the Guardian ad Litem or until the Court removes the Guardian ad Litem or no longer has jurisdiction, whichever first occurs:

- To conduct an independent factual investigation of the circumstances of the child, including, without limitation, the circumstances described in the petition.
- To file with the Court prior to any adjudicatory, review, or permanency hearing a written report stating the results of the investigation, the Guardian ad Litem's recommendations and such other information as the Court may require. In all post-adjudicatory reports, the Guardian ad Litem shall inquire of any child capable of expressing his or her wishes regarding permanency and, when applicable, the transition from foster care to independent living and shall include the child's express wishes in the report to the Court. The Guardian ad Litem's written report shall be delivered to the Court, with copies to all parties to the case at least five (5) days before the date set for the hearing. The report submitted prior to the adjudicatory hearing shall not be admitted into evidence at the hearing and shall be used by the Court only for disposition if the child is found to be within the purview of the act.
- To act as an advocate for the child for whom appointed at each stage of proceedings under this chapter. To that end, the Guardian ad Litem shall participate fully in the proceedings and to the degree necessary to adequately advocate for the child's best interests, and shall be entitled to confer with the child, the child's siblings, the child's parents and any other individual, or entity having information relevant to the child protection case.
- To monitor the circumstances of a child and to assure that the terms of the Court's orders are being fulfilled and remain in the best interest of the child.
- To maintain all information regarding the case confidential and to not disclose the same except to the Court or to other parties to the case.
- Such other and further duties as may be expressly imposed by the court order.





Our GAL/CASA volunteers are community members working collaboratively to support children and families involved in the child welfare system. Our volunteers come from different backgrounds, neighborhoods and communities just like the kids they serve.

Each volunteer gets to know the child, parents and their family. By getting to know the parents and family, we can better serve the children and help make sure everyone has what they need to heal and thrive.

GAL/CASA volunteers provide information through court reports and testimony and make recommendations in the child's best interest to the judge to help them make informed decisions. GAL/CASA volunteers help maintain a sense of urgency to all children's cases and recognize that permanency (both legal and relational) is essential to well-being.

FIVE KEY ACTIONS OF A GAL/CASA VOLUNTEER



ADVOCATE Speak up for the child's best

interest in court and the community.



SUPPORT

Provide a stable and caring relationship by building trust with the child through consistent visits.



COLLABORATE

Collaborate with social workers and other professionals to ensure the child is safe and his or her needs are met.



INVESTIGATE

Gather important information about the family and child's current situation.

REPORT

Report what you have learned and observed to the court to assist in making decisions in the best interest of the child.



A GAL/CASA volunteer works to ensure a child's best interest is being met by:

- Identifying and addressing risks to the child's safety and well-being,
- Identifying supportive people in the child's life that they can work with to promote safety and well-being for the child during their time in care,
- Ensuring appropriate physical and mental health assessments are completed and that the child's needs are understood by the family and everyone involved in the case through a trauma-informed approach, and
- Verifying educational assessments are completed and educational supports are in place.
- GAL/CASA volunteers advocate for the best interest of a child and make informed recommendations for the child's physical and emotional well-being to the judge.
- GAL/CASA volunteers stay by a child's side throughout the case, advocating first for reunification
 when safe and possible. If reunification is not safe or possible, GAL/CASA volunteers will advocate
 for the child to be adopted by, or live with, other relatives or family friends. If that is also not
 possible, GAL/CASA volunteers will work towards adoption by a non-relative. No matter what,
 GAL/CASA volunteers will keep in contact with the support network until the case closes so that
 everyone continues to put the child's best interests first.
- A GAL/CASA volunteer is a consistent presence in a child's life while working collaboratively with others involved in the case.

GAL/CASA Volunteers

When she started, she stuck to one case at a time, so she could balance teaching and volunteering. Vicki is an avid traveler and regularly takes trips with her husband and with her friends. Vicki stays active and very involved in our community. She walks dogs at the animal shelter, volunteers at the food basket, and serves meals at the soup kitchen. Her tireless efforts and enthusiasm inspire the entire program. We are profoundly grateful for her invaluable contributions, which have undoubtedly enriched countless lives.

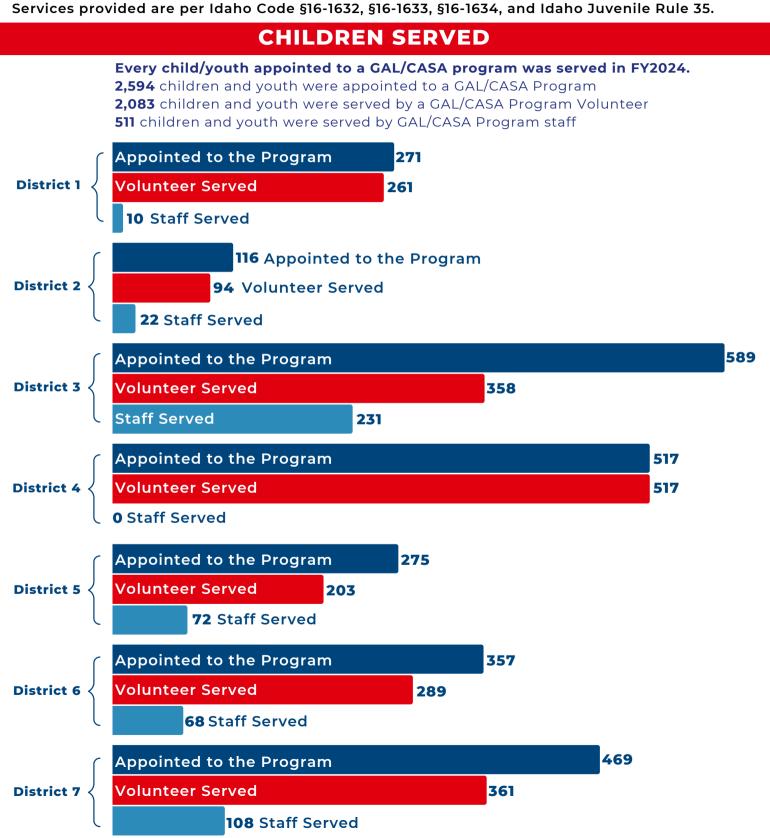

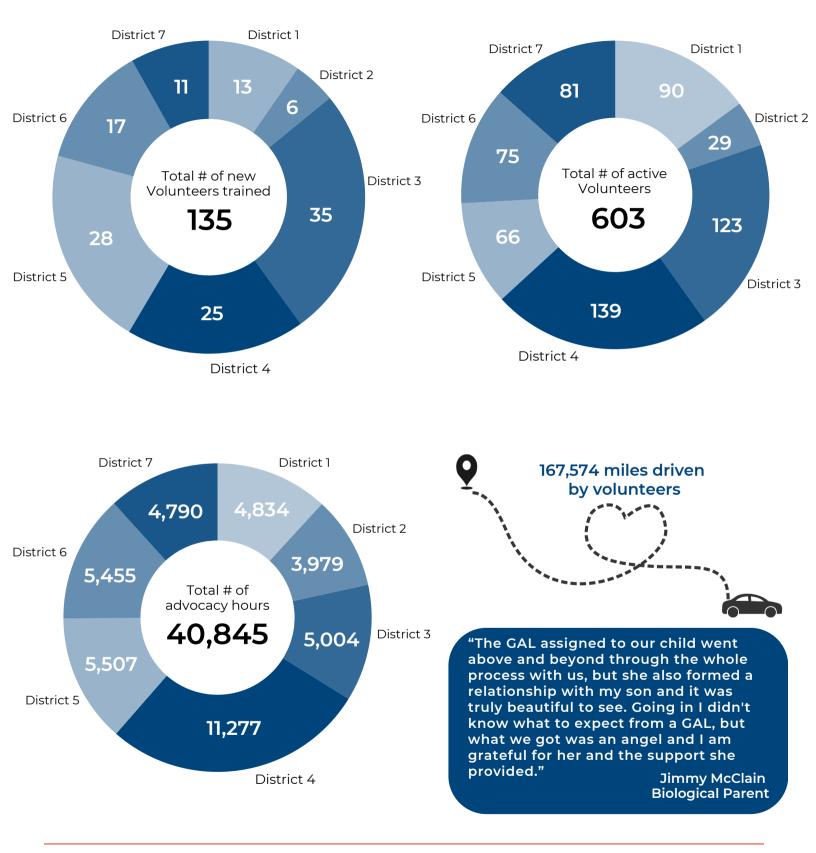

ADVOCATES BY THE NUMBERS



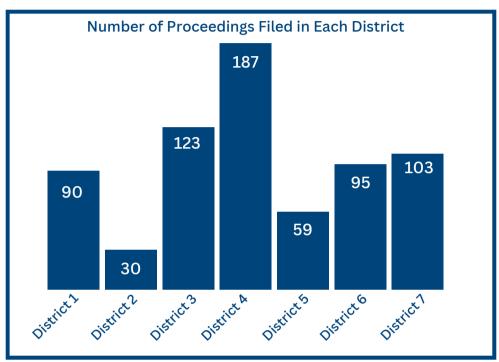

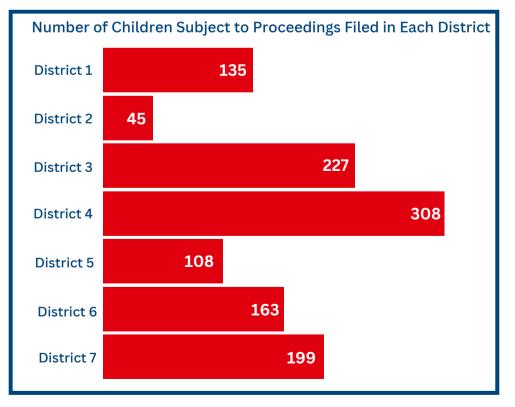
