In response to ongoing communication with drug and mental health court coordinators, the ISTARS-problem solving court module: minimum data elements were created in 2007, for the purpose of identifying the minimum data requirements necessary for ongoing evaluations. Within this text, there are several screenshots of the ISTARS Problem-Solving Court Module accompanied by brief descriptions as to the necessity of the information. Each data field or element has been indicated with a **black box**.

Additionally, the Supreme Court Planning and Research department will continue to assist in an evaluation of data quality to identify errors, duplicates, or missing data based on the elements contained in this document. Together with your help, the data can be maintained at a high level for day to day operations, frequent data requests, and quality outcome evaluations to identify outcomes and improvements.

Employment information is arguable one of the highest predictor of success with the criminal justice population. In order to be able to assess if participants are engaging in this pro-social activity, we would need to record when the participant became employed, thereby discerning if the court had influence on their ability to obtain employment, we would need to record employment information at intake, at termination and if they found employment while in drug court.

If an offender/ participant has successfully completed all educational requirements while in the court, it should be indicated.

It would be beneficial to record the various assessment instruments utilized, as well as the score, classification and test date of the substance abuse assessment & the clinical assessment aka mental health assessment (if provided). The Criminogenic Assessment (either the adult LSI-R or juvenile YLS/CMI) should be recorded, as well as, the LSI score, domains, and test date should be collected in order to establish a baseline of assessment information on participants. Additional tests conducted at a later date should also be recorded in order to establish change in the criminogenic risk and needs of offenders.

Also, additional rationales for record drug testing information for drug court participants would be to measure drug court success in terms of cessation of drug/alcohol use.
