SB 1048 Changes Parking Violation Statutes

Senate Bill 1048 changes parking violation statutes, which went into effect on 3/22/13. The effect of the language change is that the Idaho courts will no longer send parking violations to the Idaho Transportation Department. The ITD will no longer suspend a driver's license for fail to pay a parking violation. These changes have been made in the ISTARs data Bases throughout the state. Any parking tickets which may have been suspended by ISTARs until all changes were finalized are being intercepted at ITD and disposed of without importing into their system. Questions? Open Enrollment information available

This year's medical, dental and FSA Open Enrollment will be conducted from April 29th through May 17th. For more information and key plan changes, please review [this memo](#) from the Office of Group Insurance. Good news—insurance premiums will not be increased!

The State Controller's Office continues to support the Idaho Information Technology Resource Management Council's (ITRMC) proposed adoption of Internet Explorer as the statewide standard browser and currently supports Internet Explorer versions 7.0 and 8.0. Recognizing that ITRMC just approved Internet Explorer version 10 on April 2, 2013, the SCO does not anticipate supporting IE 10 until after ITRMC's six month review cycle is completed this fall.

The State Controller's Office is aware that IE 10 users are encountering several processing issues with some of the SCO web applications. With the expectation of processing errors, it has become necessary to block IE 10 access to specific SCO web applications at this time (IPOPS, I-Time, and Employee Self Service).

Beginning 04/26/2013, IE 10 users will receive the following message when attempting to access SCO web applications:

Internet Explorer 10 - Access Denied:

IE 10 users are encountering several critical processing errors within certain SCO Web applications (IPOPS, I-Time, and Employee Self Service). IE 10 access is being denied pending system modifications to correct the errors.

Per ITRMC's standards, the State Controller's Office currently supports IE 7 and IE 8. If you need assistance installing a compatible web browser, please contact your agency's IT department.

Be assured the SCO staff will be diligently working on any modifications needed to rectify the processing issues. Once we have successfully updated our applications to work with newer versions of Internet Explorer, we will notify you.

We also understand that employees may be using other browsers at work and home. Although some SCO web applications may allow access with other browsers, complete functionality is not guaranteed. Again, please remember that we currently support the above mentioned browsers.

National prescription drug take back day

Saturday, April 27th is National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. If you have unused or old prescription drugs tucked away in closets, drawers, or cabinets, this is your day! Worksite blood pressure screening

High blood pressure is the number one risk factor for stroke. Over one in four Idaho adults reports being diagnosed with high blood pressure and it's estimated that approximately 8% of the adult population has undiagnosed high blood pressure. In Idaho that estimate equates to over 92,000 undiagnosed adults.

What's that all mean? The bottom line is high blood pressure can cause a stroke. Strokes are no fun. They can strike at *any* age. They can leave you with permanent and irreversible damage.
