





Open enrollment is April 28, 2014 thru May 16, 2014

During open enrollment if you want to:

- > Change from one medical plan to another (PPO, Traditional, High Deductible)
- > Add previously declined dependent dental coverage
- > Change premiums deductions from post-tax to pre-tax and vice versa you **MUST** do so during Open Enrollment.

Open enrollment also provides an opportunity for employees to enroll or re-enroll in the Flexible Spending Account (FSA) for medical and/or dependent care. Enrollment in the FSA is on a year-by-year basis and elections do not continue from one year to the next.

Open enrollment is done on-line at the State Controller's website. If you do not know your password for this website, please email hr@idcourts.net and your password will be reset for you.

Please do not try and enroll or make changes prior to April 28, 2014, as it will be deleted and will not be processed.




Welcome, Wade Howland!



Please join us for a ceremony to unveil the Robert Todd Lincoln Suite of Office Furniture, as it goes on public display in the Ada County Courthouse Lobby.

This historic furniture suite, donated in honor of Ginny McCormac, Civic Leader, was once utilized by Robert Todd Lincoln while serving as Special Counsel of the Pullman Palace Car Company in Chicago, Illinois. Robert was the son of U.S. President Abraham Lincoln, who signed an Act creating the Idaho Territory in 1863.
