

SUMMARY STATEMENT

Wilson v. King, Docket No. 43086

The Idaho Supreme Court affirmed the decision of a Nez Perce County district judge holding that a non-Idaho resident had not subjected himself to the jurisdiction of Idaho courts by previously litigating child custody and child support matters in Idaho courts. Although bringing suit in Idaho would usually subject a litigant to jurisdiction on other matters in Idaho, the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act and the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act each protect litigants from broader jurisdiction when they sue only on child custody and child support issues.
