

SUMMARY STATEMENT

State v. Loera, Docket No. 46849

This appeal arises from Justin James Loera's conviction for battery on a correctional officer. Loera asserts the district court erred in three respects: first, by partially quashing his subpoena *duces tecum* based on its relevance rather than the standards prescribed in Idaho Criminal Rule 17(b); second, for ordering restitution without sufficient evidence; and third, by failing to address his request for credit for time served. The Idaho Supreme Court affirmed the district court's decision to partially quash Loera's subpoena *duces tecum*. However, the Court vacated the district court's order awarding restitution and remanded the case with instructions for the court to award Loera 202 days of credit for time served.
