SUMMARY STATEMENT

State of Idaho v. Paul Aaron Greer Docket No. 48783

In this case arising out of Kootenai County, the Court of Appeals affirmed Paul Aaron Greer's judgment of conviction and unified sentence of seven years, with a minimum period of confinement of two years, for felony domestic battery. During Greer's sentencing hearing, he asserted that the section of his presentence investigation report (PSI) describing his criminal history should be modified to reflect the charges that would be dismissed in exchange for his guilty plea. The district court agreed. After hearing the parties' sentencing recommendations, the district court sentenced Greer to a unified term of seven years, with a minimum period of confinement of two years. Greer appealed.

On appeal to the Idaho Court of Appeals, Greer argued that the district court erred by failing to redline the criminal history section of his PSI with his proposed change. Greer also argued that his sentence is excessive. The Court of Appeals held that Greer failed to provide a sufficient record to support his redlining claim because the record on appeal contained only a copy of the PSI filed before the sentencing hearing. The Court of Appeals further held that Greer failed to show that the district court abused its sentencing discretion. Consequently, the Court of Appeals affirmed Greer's judgment of conviction and sentence for felony domestic battery.
