Travis William Coats entered a conditional guilty plea to felony DUI and reserved the right to appeal the district court's partial denial of his motion to suppress. Prior to entering his conditional guilty plea, Coats filed a motion to suppress statements he made to police and the results of a warrantless blood draw. The district court held a hearing on Coats' motion to suppress. The district court granted in part and denied in part Coats' motion. The district court suppressed statements made by Coats during interrogation after he invoked his right to remain silent. However, the court denied the motion insofar as Coats sought to suppress the results of the blood test. Coats contends the district court erred in failing to suppress the blood test results.
