This is an appeal from an order of the Industrial Commission's ("Commission") decision denying that Dr. Richard Jobe's ("Jobe") methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) infection constituted a compensable occupational disease. The Commission denied Jobe's claim because it found Jobe failed to prove that his MRSA infection was caused by his employment with Dirne Clinic/Heritage Health ("Heritage"). Jobe appeals arguing the Commission applied the wrong legal standard in requiring him to prove his MRSA infection was caused by his employment at Heritage.
