Richard Wilson (“Wilson”) appeals from a judgment of conviction for two counts of aiding and abetting trafficking methamphetamine on the grounds that the State presented insufficient evidence to support his convictions. Specifically, he argues that the State did not present any evidence that he knew (1) that methamphetamine was being sold; (2) that the principal, Regina Jones, had represented the amount of methamphetamine sold on April 27th to be one ounce; or (3) that he knew about any representations Regina Jones had made about the methamphetamine. The State argues that it proved Wilson’s intent to aid and abet by showing his extensive participation in the sales, including participating in sending the “signal” to buyers, providing transportation to the April 27th sale, and receiving proceeds from the April 27th sale.
