Kayla Dianne Hanchey pled guilty to an offense in two separate cases and was sentenced to concurrent, unified five-year terms, with minimum periods of confinement of two years. The district court suspended the sentences and placed Hanchey on probation for three years. Shortly thereafter, Hanchey admitted violating her probation; her probation was revoked; and she served a period of retained jurisdiction. Hanchey was then placed back on probation for three years and absconded when the State moved to revoke her probation a second time. Subsequently, Hanchey voluntarily appeared in court and admitted violating her probation. Ultimately, the district court revoked Hanchey’s probation again and imposed her underlying sentences. Hanchey appeals, arguing the district court erred in revoking her probation and by failing to redline certain information in her updated presentence investigation report.
