Jesse David Rebo appeals from the district court’s denial of his motion to suppress. The district court denied Rebo’s motion after finding Rebo lacked standing to challenge an officer’s warrantless entry into his residence. The district court held society would not recognize Rebo’s subjective expectation of privacy in the residence as objectively reasonable because a valid no contact order prohibited Rebo from being within three hundred feet of the residence. Rebo appeals, arguing the district court’s finding that he lacked standing was erroneous. More, Rebo argues no exigent circumstances existed that justified the officer’s warrantless entry and that the drug evidence discovered after the officer’s misconduct should have been suppressed as “fruit of the poisonous tree.”
