Idaho Rules of Civil Procedure Rule 20. Permissive Joinder of Parties.

(a)	Persons Who May Join or be Joined.
(1)	Plaintiffs. Persons may join in one action as plaintiffs if:
٠,	they assert any right to relief jointly, severally, or in the alternative with respect to or arising out of the same saction, occurrence, or series of transactions or occurrences; and
(B)	any question of law or fact common to all plaintiffs will arise in the action.
(2)	Defendants. Persons may be joined in one action as defendants if:
	any right to relief is asserted against them jointly, severally, or in the alternative with respect to or arising out of the le transaction, occurrence, or series of transactions or occurrences; and
(B)	any question of law or fact common to all defendants will arise in the action.
relie	Extent of Relief. Neither a plaintiff nor a defendant need be interested in obtaining or defending against all the of demanded. The court may grant judgment to one or more plaintiffs according to their rights, and against one or defendants according to their liabilities.
aga asse	Protective Measures. The court may issue orders, including an order for separate trials, to protect a party inst embarrassment, delay, expense, or other prejudice that arises from including a person against whom the party erts no claim and who asserts no claim against the party. The court may also direct a final judgment on a claim of or inst one or more parties as provided in Rule 54(b).
